**ORDER REGARDING TIME PERIODS ENDING  
ON SEPTEMBER 3, 6, AND 7, 2004**

On September 3 and 7, 2004, because of Hurricane Frances, and also on September 6, 2004, because of Labor Day, all divisions of the United States District Court and the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida were closed, making the offices of the Clerk of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida inaccessible. Rule 9006(a), Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, provides in part:

**Rule 9006. Time**


(a) **COMPUTATION.** In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by these rules or by the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure made applicable by these rules, by the local rules, by order of court, or by any applicable statute, the day of the act, event, or default from which the designated period of time begins to run shall not be included. The last day of the period so computed shall be included, unless it is a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday, or, when the act to be done is the filing of a paper in court, a day on which weather or other conditions have made the clerk's office inaccessible, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day which is not one of the aforementioned days. ... (Emphasis supplied).

Accordingly,

**IT IS ORDERED** that because of the closing of all divisions of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida on September 3, 6, and 7, 2004, and the resulting inaccessibility of the Clerk's Office on those dates, time periods for all cases in all divisions of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida are extended in accordance with Rule 9006(a), Fed. R. Bankr. P.
