The lawyer volunteers at the Clinic can help the pro se litigant understand the bankruptcy process and provide limited case-specific advice, but they cannot represent the litigant in court or file pleadings.

- WRITE A LIST OF SPECIFIC QUESTIONS FOR THE ATTORNEY
- BRING THE MOST RECENT COURT PAPERS THAT WERE SERVED ON YOU OR THAT YOU FILED WITH THE COURT
- BRING ALL DOCUMENTS, CONTRACTS & PAPERWORK RELATED TO YOUR CASE, INCLUDING YOUR BANKRUPTCY SCHEDULES OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES
- IDENTIFY ANY DEADLINES AND TELL US ABOUT THEM FIRST
- DO RESEARCH AND KNOW THE FACTS OF YOUR CASE BEFORE YOUR APPOINTMENT

The Clinic provides the pro se debtor or creditor the opportunity to meet, one-on-one, with a volunteer bankruptcy attorney for a free half-hour consultation.
