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
The Middle District of Florida Bankruptcy Pro Se Assistance Clinic is a nonprofit charitable organization comprised of attorney member volunteers in collaboration with the Tampa Bay Bankruptcy Bar Association.

The Clinic is staffed by experienced bankruptcy lawyers and offers free, on-site information and guidance to individuals who are representing themselves in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court. The lawyer volunteers at the Clinic can help the pro se individual understand the bankruptcy process and provide limited case-specific advice, but they cannot represent the individual in court or file pleadings.

Pro Se Assistance Clinic

The Middle District of Florida Bankruptcy Pro Se Assistance Clinic is staffed by volunteer lawyers, who are not paid for their work. Because it is a volunteer program, they are not permitted to solicit clients while they are providing free consultations for the Clinic; nor should they use the sessions to talk about representing you. If you decide after your appointment that you need additional legal assistance and would like to try and find a lawyer, please see the materials available in the Clinic or visit our website for more information.

WHAT WE DO...

- Provide limited legal advice and information on Bankruptcy issues in the Middle District of Florida
- Assist you in preparing court documents and presenting your case
- Provide referrals and other resource information

WHAT WE DO NOT DO...

We DO NOT give advice on:

- CRIMINAL LEGAL ISSUES
- STATE COURT CASES
- NON-BANKRUPTCY RELATED ISSUES

We DO NOT provide representation in court and will not represent you as your attorney

We DO NOT file pleadings on your behalf

We DO NOT give advice over the telephone or via E-mail

Additionally, people involved in some specific disputes may qualify for a free attorney, depending on their income level. WHAT INFORMATION DO I NEED TO BRING?

- Bring the most recent court papers that were served on you or that you filed with the court
- Bring all documents, contracts, and paperwork related to your case; including your bankruptcy Schedules of Assets and Liabilities
- Identify any deadlines and tell us about them first
- Visit http://www.flmb.uscourts.gov/filing_without_attorney/ for guides and other valuable resources.

WHEN CAN I GET HELP AT THE CLINIC?

The Clinic's office is open: Mondays 1:00-4:00pm and Wednesdays from 1:00-4:00pm.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT WHEN I ARRIVE AT THE CLINIC?

You will need to complete an Intake Form and Liability Waiver at the Clinic before an attorney can see you.

HOW LONG IS MY CONSULTATION?

The pro se debtor/creditor is provided the opportunity to meet with a volunteer bankruptcy attorney at the Clinic for a free half-hour consultation.

WHERE CAN I GET HELP IF THE CLINIC IS CLOSED?
