Judge Burgess received a B.A. at The University of Alabama, a J.D. at Florida Coastal School of Law, and an LL.M. in Business Transactions, *magna cum laude*, from The University of Alabama School of Law. Burgess, LLC, and served as a Subchapter V Chapter 11 Trustee for both the Middle and Northern Districts of Florida.

He is Past-President of the Jacksonville Bankruptcy Bar Association and served on the Middle District's Steering Committee and Local Rules Lawyers' Advisory Committee.
