PROCEDURES GOVERNING COURT APPEARANCES BEFORE JUDGES VAUGHAN, ROBSON AND GEYER EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 2022* (*The procedures below were updated August 1, 2022)

Effective May 1, 2022, Judges Vaughan, Robson and Geyer will return to <u>in-person</u> <u>hearings</u>. Virtual appearances are no longer automatic; however, consistent with prepandemic procedures, attorneys and parties located OUTSIDE the Orlando Division¹ of the Middle District of Florida may participate in non-evidentiary hearings by Zoom or Court Solutions.

Video/Telephonic Appearances:

- 1. <u>Local Counsel</u>. Counsel located in the Orlando Division ("<u>Local Counsel</u>") are expected to appear in-person unless otherwise permitted in compliance with these procedures.
 - a. Local Counsel may request to appear via Zoom by contacting chambers (via email to the courtroom deputy and law clerk listed below) **no later than 4 p.m. two business days before the hearing** and explain the need to attend remotely.

 - b. Zoom appearances for Local Counsel are reserved for limited circumstances based upon a showing of need and are subject to the discretion of the presiding judge.
- 2. <u>Outside Counsel</u>. Counsel located outside the Orlando Division ("<u>Outside</u> <u>Counsel</u>") may appear by Zoom <u>without prior Court approval</u> provided these procedures are followed.
- 3. <u>Parties</u>. With permission from chambers: (1) unrepresented individuals may attend hearings by Zoom, and (2) parties represented by counsel may attend hearings by Zoom or Court Solutions on a "listen only" basis.

¹ The Orlando Division consists of the following counties: Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, and Volusia. *See* Local Rule 1071-1(b)(2).

- 4. <u>Trials/Evidentiary Hearings</u>. Telephonic/Zoom appearances are **NOT** allowed for trials or evidentiary hearings. All participants are expected to attend in-person. In rare circumstances, the Court may permit a witness to testify remotely using Zoom. Requests must be made by filing a motion no later than **14 days** before the hearing. The motion should detail why the individual cannot appear in-person and whether the opposing party consents to the video testimony.
- 5. <u>Court Solutions</u>. Judges Vaughan, Robson and Geyer use Court Solutions for telephonic appearances. Please refer to the <u>Procedure Manual Guide</u> (<u>uscourts.gov</u>) for information on Court Solutions and telephonic hearing decorum. If permitted to appear telephonically under these procedures, participants must submit a request to Court Solutions no later than the **business day before the hearing date**.
- 6. Judge Vaughan, Robson and Geyer prefer Zoom over telephone; however, telephonic appearances are permitted in non-evidentiary matters subject to the above requirements.
- 7. Persons appearing by Zoom must dress appropriately for Court and have the camera on.
- 8. To the extent these Procedures conflict with a Notice of Hearing or Court Order, such Notice or Order controls.
